







Provides tourist information and guides that explain in an easy-to-understand way the appeal of Hiraizumi's cultural heritage including the cultural assets registered as world heritage. Illustrations of the history of Hiraizumi and chronological records of the important cultural assets are on display. You can also try wearing a junihitoe which was a ceremonial kimono worn in the Heian period at certain times of year.



Inbound service

A tool that can translate signs in several different languages and display several languages

QR Translator



Stickers that enable you to use a QR translator without a specialist app are stuck on information and guidance signs throughout the town center.

When you use your smartphone to read the QRT code within these stickers and access the URL that is displayed, information including explanations of heritage assets and related assets as well as map information is displayed in the mother tongue of the user's device. You are free to change the language displayed and it is possible to be able to display information in 15 languages.

Languages that can be displayed (15 different ones)

Japanese, English, simplified Chinese characters, Korean, traditional Chinese characters, France, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Russian, Vietnam, Thai, Indonesian and Malay.



Takkoku no Iwaya, Kanjizaio-in Ato, Muryoko-in Ato and Mt. Kinkeisan will be displayed using the QRT code on the left. Hold your smartphone over it and give it a try.

World Heritage Hiraizumi Audio Guide

Audio Guide Pens



You can borrow an audio guide (audio pen) for explanations of sites around town in 7 different languages. Just touch the pictures or icons in the specialized pamphlets with the pen and you can listen to information about the sights and places here. [Price: ¥500 per audio pen (including tax)]

Languages that can be displayed (7 different ones)

Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, French, German and Spanish.

Places to lend and return audio pens

Hiraizumi Tourist Information Office (in front of Hiraizumi Station), entrance to Chuson-ji Tsukimizaka Slope (taxi office), in front of Chuson-ji Sankozo Shop, Motsu-ji Temple, Michi no Eki Hiraizumi and Hiraizumi Tourist Rest Center.
